Lousy (خراب):

- ✓ Something very bad or poor in manner / quality.
- This hotel has lousy food and service.
- Lousy weather makes me uncomfortable.

Facilitate (آسانه كول):

- ✓ Make something easier or smoother.
- High-speed trains facilitate transportation. [High-speed trains make transportation easier.]

Consolidate (زور خاى كول - خېټلى كول):

- ✓ Make something physically powerful or stronger.
- ✓ To integrate / merge many things into one to make it stronger.
- Exercise and meditation can help you to consolidate your body parts.
- By consolidating a supplier base, the core suppliers will get a larger piece in the share market.
- There are six servers being consolidated to get 2GB per second internet speed.

Discrepancy (فرق - توپير):

- ✓ Difference or variation between two or more entities.
- Why there is a huge discrepancy between those two points?
- There would be no discrepancy between option A and option C.

Candid (بې رڼا - په زړه سپېڅلى):

- ✓ Honest or frank or open or straightforward.
- I am pretty sure that James is a candid man.
- She got the reputation and fame for being a candid politician.

Affable (مودب - مهربان - نرم - مينه ناک):

- ✓ Friendly or gentle or polite.
- Americans have an affable and amiable nature.
- Max is affable with all his classmates and professors.

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Callow (بی تجربہ - خام عمرہ):

- ✓ Someone is immature or not experienced.
- Edward is callow for his age.
- He is more callow than her.
- Many of us are callow undergraduates

Remorse (پشیمانی / افسوس):

- ✓ Feeling of being sorry after committing something wrong.
- She hasn't shown any remorse for a wrong commitment. ← عذرہ
- My friends were filled with remorse and shame for what they did.

Ambiguous (مبہم / غیری واضح / ناخردند):

- ✓ Something has more than one meaning or not having one obvious meaning.
- The meaning of this question is ambiguous.
- Their statements are ambiguous or meaningless.

Aloof (بی علاقہ):

- ✓ Something not friendly or not interested in.
- It's really hard to be aloof in this environment.
- I don't like the aloof people.
- He is an aloof guy, so we won't invite him.

Temperament (مزاج / طبیعت):

- ✓ Someone's nature or character or personality.
- Mike and Jake both had different temperaments. Mike was a risk-taker and Jake was a cautious trader.
- Success and failure are depended on our temperament.

Entrepreneur (تاجر / اصلی مؤسس یا چلوئیک):

- ✓ Someone who manages the business, businessman.
- I want to be a successful entrepreneur.
- Miz is a software entrepreneur who had worked at Yahoo.

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Ardent (آبروان):

- ✓ Someone passionate about something, or have a strong belief in something.
- Ronaldo and Messi are the ardent football players.
- By the time, My husband became more ardent about his business.

Berate (ملامتول/ رذل/ نیوکه کول):

- ✓ To scold or criticize someone.
- My daddy berated me for being out until late night.
- The professor berated James in the presence of others.

Fiasco (ماته/ ناکامی):

- ✓ Something is a complete failure or disaster.
- That movie was a fiasco. No one liked it.
- He is a fiasco as his father.
- My business has turned out to be a fiasco

Blissful (خوشحاله/ هوښا):

- ✓ Full of joy or very happy.
- We have plenty of blissful moments with you.
- Living with family gives me a blissful feeling.

Withhold (منع کول/ بندول/ ردول):

- ✓ Refuse or deny to give something.
- Japan withholds visas of many visitors for the security reason.
- Why are you withholding important information from us?

Magnificent (ښکلی/ زړه وړونکی):

- ✓ Something looks very beautiful or stunning.
- This magnificent beach is one of the top ten beaches in the world.
- Sky dive over Dubai Islands is a magnificent view.

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Daft (اڊنی / احمق):

- ✓ Stupid, foolish or silly.
- I made a lot of daft decisions.
- I can't believe how daft he was.
- She was daft enough to believe John.

Nepotism (طرفدار / واسطہ):

- ✓ Process of hiring or promotion of a family members/ relatives / friends.
- We will take action against corruption and nepotism.
- Nepotism is general and rife nowadays.
- Their kids can earn in millions just because of nepotism.

Dire (دیرنادرہ):

- ✓ Something extremely serious or urgent.
- They have got some dire problems.
- I was in dire need of money. [I was in urgent need of money.]
- There is a dire need for blood donations.

Contrite (توبہگار / پشیمانہ):

- ✓ Feeling sorry or guilty for something wrong that you have committed.
- I was contrite for what I have done with your family.
- I hope he accepts my contrite apology for abusing him.

Bizarre (ناشنا / عجیبہ):

- ✓ Something very strange or unusual or odd.
- He had a bizarre dream last Monday.
- This ocean is making a bizarre sound.
- I heard a bizarre noise coming from Mike's room yesterday.

Famished (دیر ویدی):

- ✓ Someone very hungry or dying of hunger.
- I was famished, so I felt faint.

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- The children are always famished when they get back from school.

Rectify (سمول / صحيح كول):

✓ To correct something.

- An apology is easy to make, actions are harder to rectify.
- Poor performance works hard to rectify the issues before the next game!

Surmount (پير لاسي كيدل):

✓ To overcome.

- How do we surmount the problem of road infrastructure and healthcare?

Pacify (ارامول / كراول):

✓ To calm down.

- What is the best way to pacify a crying baby?
- How did you pacify your kids at restaurants/doctors' offices?

Controversy (مخالفت / شخړه):

✓ Disagreement or dispute or debate.

- His son responded to the Jack & Jill controversy.
- She doesn't want to be in controversy anymore.

Prominent (مشهوره / نوميالي):

✓ Important or well known or famous.

- He was a prominent leader and a powerful voice of the oppressed.
- He occupies a prominent position in the military forces.

Pursue (تعقيبول / پسي كيدل):

✓ To follow in order to catch something; to chase.

- I promise to pursue the investigations to a logical conclusion.
- Will learning Linux benefit me if I plan to pursue a career in Data Science?
- How do I convince my parents that I want to pursue music in college?

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✓ Derive (سرچینه اخیستل / دیوی کلیمی اصلی ریښه موندل):

- ✓ To get something from a source or origin.
- Many English words are derived from Latin and Greek.
- Do you know how to derive a formula from a data model?

Snap (خرپ متول):

- ✓ To break something suddenly and quickly with a cracking sound.
- Jake snapped a picture of me.
- The cat snapped up the meat.

Abuse (ښکتنل کول / بدې ردې ویل):

- ✓ To hurt/insult someone or use of something for the wrong purpose.
- They abused our trust.
- She is abusing her authority.

Ruse (تکي / چل / درغلي):

- ✓ A trick intended to deceive someone.
- Look at her face, she was so confident in her ruse.
- The phone call was a ruse to get him out of the house.

Accompany (ملګرتیا کول / بدرقه کول / ملتیا کول):

- ✓ To go with someone as a companion or associate or escort.
- I accompanied her on the trip.
- My boyfriend accompanies me to a business-related dinner.

Accuse (تورن کول / ملامتول / تهمت لګول):

- ✓ To charge someone with a fault or crime.
- He is accused of murder.
- He accuses my son of faking my signature.
- She accused me of stealing her money.

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Vast (ستر / پراخه / اوی):

- ✓ Huge or immense.
- The Sahara is a vast desert.
- Partners are already a close contact in the vast majority of cases.

Acquire (لاسته راول / حاصلول):

- ✓ To buy something or to develop/get something like a skill, knowledge, expertise or habit, etc.
- I have acquired American citizenship.
- He acquired English quickly using this App.
- He acquired the habit of smoking.

Adequate (بس(کافی) / مناسب / ور):

- ✓ Something enough or sufficient.
- Is your salary adequate to support your family?
- We have adequate inventories of the product to meet an international demand.

Exceed (زیاتیدل / له حده ډیریدل):

- ✓ To be greater than.
- Don't exceed the speed limit.
- The population of India has already exceeded 1.4 billion.

Admire (صفت کول / ښه ویل / شاباصیویل):

- ✓ To praise or applaud.
- I admire your presence of mind and dedication.
- I have admired Maria for her bravery and honesty.

Ultimately (په پای کی / په نتيجه کی):

- ✓ Finally, or in the end.
- Who is ultimately responsible for this act?
- He ultimately opted not to go ahead with the Superman stunt.

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Adolescent (ڙٺڪي ٽوپ / خواني):

- ✓ Process of growing from a child into an adult. People between 10 and 19 years of age are known as adolescents.
- We have many adolescent followers.
- I'm a child and adolescent psychiatrist.
- Swimming helped my adolescent body grow.

Burden (هشار / بوج / زور پر اچول):

- ✓ Load or carry something heavy.
- You shouldn't feel like a burden to everyone.
- He won't take care of himself and has become a burden on the family.

Bury (پڻخول / خاورو لاندې ڪول):

- ✓ To put something/someone underground.
- Do you want to see where my dad is buried?
- She wanted her father buried next to her mother.

Anticipate (پيش بيني ڪول / اٽڪلول / گومان ڪول):

- ✓ To predict or expect that something will happen.
- We often anticipate the rainbow after the rain.
- They didn't show everything we anticipated!

Appropriate (مناسب / خاص):

- ✓ Something suitable or proper.
- What's the appropriate amount of cash to give as a wedding present?
- These clothes are not appropriate for a cold winter day.

Chase (ڙڳلول / ڀڻڪار ڪول / تعقيب ڪول):

- ✓ To follow someone/something in order to catch or reach them.
- My cat doesn't chase mice.
- The policeman chased the thief.
- A person who chases two rabbits won't catch either.

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Defeat (ماتہ ورکول / پہا تائبہ کول):

- ✓ To beat someone in a game, fight, or competition.
- We had defeated them in a war in 1980.
- James was defeated by Merry with 7.3% of the total votes.

Assault (برغل / حملہ کول):

- ✓ To make a physical attack on someone.
- Rioters assaulted police officers in China.
- A journalist was brutally assaulted by the mob.

Aside (یوہ خوا / یو خنک تہ):

- ✓ To one side or away.
- Would you please stand aside?
- I stepped aside for the old lady to pass.
- Put a piece of cake aside for me. I will eat later.

Barrier (خند / حدود / مانع):

- ✓ An object or thing that prevents movement or access physically.
- They are forming a barrier between protestors and police.
- I have shown that no barrier is high enough if you have the talent and determination.

Alter (بدلول / نوینت ورکول):

- ✓ To make something different without completely changing it.
- We should alter lifestyle time to time.
- The government will alter its foreign policy.

Abandon (خوشی کول / پرہیز کول):

- ✓ To run away from someone or something, or to give up something completely.
- Sara abandoned her hope of becoming an actor.
- Many drivers abandoned their cars in the moving flood water.

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Ceremony (مراسم / مجلس / رسمي ناسته):

- ✓ A formal religious or public occasion/event.
- I attended a beautiful wedding ceremony last Sunday.
- The graduation ceremony will take place on June 9th.

Clue (تنبه / علامه / اثار):

- ✓ A sign or some information used to find something.
- The lady has no clue what is happening with her.
- The police have few clues to search for missing girl.

Aid (مرسته يا مرسته كول):

- ✓ Help or support.
- We are selling a first aid kit for free. [used as a noun]
- I have asked my parents something about financial aid. [used as a noun]

Coast (سمندر غاره / ساحل):

- ✓ An area next to the sea or seashore.
- My office faces the coast.
- A cave on a coast that looks like a turtle!
- The pollution of our coasts is very serious. We must take action on that.

Demonstrate (تشریح كول / عملي توگه بياتول):

- ✓ To give a practical explanation of something or show something by example.
- Firefighter demonstrates how to extinguish a fire.
- I have demonstrated how this product works.

Negotiation (خبري اتري):

- ✓ A strategic discussion that resolves an issue in a way that both parties find acceptable.
- There is no need for negotiation. We have had enough.
- We continued negotiations with that company.

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Eventually (پہ پای کمی):

- ✓ In the end.
- Everyone dies eventually.
- If you eat a lot, you'll eventually get fat.
- They were eventually sentenced to 10 years in prison for that violent crime.

Flee (تہتیدل / پھنی کھل):

- ✓ To run away from dangerous situation or place or object.
- The time has come for us to flee. Do you fight or flee?
- After she assaults him, she hits a car while trying to flee.

Distinguish (توپیور ورکول / جلا کول / فرق کول / تشخیصول):

- ✓ To recognize a difference.
- We can't distinguish icons without tooltip.
- I need your help to distinguish fact from fiction.

Folk (اولس / خلک / یو دول موسیقی):

- ✓ To mention people in general. 2) One type of music.
 - You folks don't understand my question. [You guys don't understand my question.]
- I have noticed many folks getting excited for Halloween.

Gesture (نمایشی خبری کول / لاسو ہنورول):

- ✓ A movement of hands/head to express an idea or emotion.
- I have gestured for Jelly to sit down.
- Gesture is another way of communication. We often use gestures to convey simple messages.

Insist (تنگار / اصرار):

- ✓ To demand something forcefully.
- Please do not insist if you feel like they don't want to talk about it.
- It was raining hard, but I insisted on going for a drive.

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Merely (فقط):

- ✓ Only or just.
- My mission in life is not merely to survive, but to thrive.
- Impossibilities are merely things which we have not yet learned.

Perceive (درک کول / پوهیدل):

- ✓ To notice or realize or become aware of something.
- I could not perceive any difference between the twins.

Indeed (په حقیقت کې):

- ✓ In fact, really or certainly.
- He is, indeed, a hard worker. You are indeed a life changer.
- Indeed, we are quite knowledgeable and talented.

Prescription (نسخه):

- ✓ An instruction written by a doctor.
- I'm continuing to push for lower prescription drug costs.
- People are dying from lack of healthcare, and prescription drugs are too expensive!

Refugee (مهاجر / پناه وړونکی):

- ✓ A person who run away for safety, especially to a foreign country.
- Refugees in India are seeking help.
- Food and blankets were given to the refugees.

Stir (لړل / ګډوډول):

- ✓ To mix a liquid or other substance by moving a spoon or object in a round pattern.
- She is stirring her coffee.
- I have stirred the soup with a spoon.
- She put milk into her coffee and stirred it.

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Persuade (قانع کول):

- ✓ Make someone agree by appealing to reason or understanding.
- Do you have secret skill to persuade my daddy?
- I persuaded Jake to drive me to the airport tomorrow afternoon.

Sudden (ناڅاپه):

- ✓ Unexpected or unpredicted.
- His sudden death was a tragedy.
- There was a sudden change in her tone.
- I was disappointed at the sudden change in the plan.

Acknowledge (تصدیق کول / اعتراف کول):

- ✓ To accept the truth.
- You should acknowledge your faults.
- I just wanted to acknowledge that we are aware of this problem.

Tactic (تدبیر / تخنیک):

- ✓ A particular method or plan or strategy for achieving something.
- Folks I don't think this tactic works.
- We have to come up with a new tactic.
- We were forced to change our survival tactics.

Urge (په ټینګه غوښتل / یا سپارښتنه کول):

- ✓ To recommend something strongly. 2) A strong desire [n].
- They urged to ban all trade in wild animals and birds for eating.
- I strongly urge you to consider the request.
- The doctor urged the patient to stop smoking.

Victim (قرباني / ښکار / قرباني کيدونکی):

- ✓ Someone who has been injured or killed by crime.
- I was the victim of a heinous crime.
- He is lying about the shooting victim in SDL.

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Accomplish (پہنچا کرنا / سرتاہ رسول / پورہ کرنا):

- ✓ To complete or finish something successfully.
- They accomplished their mission without any difficulty.
- If you had helped me, I could have accomplished anything great.

Era (عصر / دور / زمانہ):

- ✓ A period of history.
- We are in the era of atomic and solar energy.
- I would like to talk about era of artificial intelligence.

Essential (ضروری / اساسی):

- ✓ Absolutely necessary or important.
- Good eating habits are essential for good health.
- Who thinks a firearm is an essential survival tool?
- Education is one of the most essential aspects of life.

Accurate (درست / سم / دقیقہ / صحیح):

- ✓ Correct or exact or precise.
- They made some accurate predictions.
- How accurate is his statement in regards to your partner?
- This is the most accurate artwork of a trip that I think I've ever seen.

Yield (حاصل ورکول / لاس اخیستل / تسلیمیدل):

- ✓ To produce or provide something. 2) To give up under pressure; surrender.
- Rich soil yields good crops.
- Stock investments do not always yield profit.

Conquer (بری موندل / فتح کرنا / نیول):

- ✓ To overcome a problem or weakness successfully. 2) To climb successfully. 3) To win war. To take control of someone or something.
- You must conquer your fear of the dark.
- Do you know who conquered Mt. Everest first?

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
